## • **DESCRIPTION OF TOWN**

#### - Short history and location

Thessaloniki is the capital of Macedonia and the second largest city of Greece. It is situated on the picturesque bay of Thermaikos and has a history of 2300 years. It is a classical city, a Hellenistic, a Byzantine, a Balkan, a Mediterranean city, a city of the East, but also of Europe. It was first established in 316 BC by Kassandros and named after his wife, Thessaloniki, sister of Alexander the Great. It was from here that St. Paul, the Apostle of nations, spread the word of Christianity (50 AD). The Roman Emperor Galerius made the city his headquarters (300 AD). From Thessaloniki, the brothers Cyril and Methodius also began their mission to civilise and preach Christianity to the people of the Balkans. Thessaloniki became the second important city of the Byzantine Empire next to Constantinople. The Turkish occupation lasted almost five centuries (1430 – 1912). The Greeks fought many wars to liberate themselves from the conquerors. In 1912 Thessaloniki was free to continue its course in history

<u>By air</u>

The city airport "Macedonia" (16 km outside Thessaloniki) serves many domestic and international flights

<u>By rail</u>

Rail services link Thessaloniki with Athens and other Greek cities. A line through former Yugoslavia provides connections with Central and Western Europe, the line through Bulgaria with Eastern Europe and the line through Turkey with the countries of the Near East. By road

Coach services are operated between Thessaloniki and other Greek cities.

Bus is the cheapest way of travelling in the city and suburbs  $(0,45 \notin \text{ticket})$ . There are bus lines connecting all the parts of the city.

Taxis in the city are not very expensive and this way of transport is quite popular especially during the rush hours.

# • SHORT DESCRIPTION OF THE ORGANISING INSTITUTION

The Aristotle University of Thessaloniki is a State Institution established in 1925. The structure of the University today, its range of activities and its size make it the largest and most complex institution of higher education in our country. Approximately 75.000 students study in the University's 44 Schools, many of which, indeed, are unique in Greece.

The University Campus covers 429 metric acres and lies in a central location of Thessaloniki. Some University Schools and faculty laboratories and facilities are situated off Campus (such as the University Farm, the Centre of Byzantine Research, the School of Physical Education and Athletics etc) as well as some independent educational or research units connected to the University (e.g. the University forests). In total, these cover some 39.000 acres. There are also some offshoots of the University.

The University Library is one of the largest in the Balkans with approximately two million volumes in the central and school libraries, each of which holds books relative to the field of study it covers. It is subscriber to 5.500 - 6.000 periodicals from all over the world and every year the Library buys approximately 450.000 books.

In the University Campus is the University Student Club, which is a self-administrated part of the University, charged with the board and lodging, the medical, pharmaceutical and hospital care of the students.

The University participates in many European educational and research projects and has international exchanges and cooperation with a substantial number of Universities throughout Europe, Australia, United States of America and Canada.
